1 Introduction

- 1.1 This **Local Development Scheme (LDS)** provides information on the documents that the Council intends to produce to form its planning policy framework and sets out the timetable and programme for their production.
- 1.2 For each of the documents that will make up Camden's planning framework, we describe their purpose, status, the area they cover and their timetable. Section 3 below and Appendix 1 provide information on the planning policy documents that the Council intends to prepare and when they will be produced.

2 Camden's planning policy framework

- 2.1 The development plan for Camden currently consists of the **Local Plan** and the Mayor's London Plan. The Local Plan contains the Council's vision, policies and proposals for the use of land and buildings in the borough.
- 2.2 The Local Plan is currently made up of the following adopted documents:
 - Camden Core Strategy (adopted 2010)
 - Camden Development Policies (adopted 2010)
 - Site Allocations (adopted 2013)
 - Statement of Community Involvement 2011
 - a range of supplementary guidance documents.
- 2.3 The Core Strategy, Development Policies and Sites Allocation document form the Council's local plan or development plan (along with the London Plan). These are have been prepared though a formal review process, which includes an independent examination held by a government-appointed Inspector. The Council's decisions on planning applications should be taken in line with these documents unless there are significant matters ('material considerations') that indicate otherwise.
- 2.4 Supplementary planning documents (SPD) are subject to public consultation but are not subject to testing at an independent examination and therefore do not have the same weight in planning decisions as development plan documents. However, they have a valuable role in complementing development plan documents with more detailed advice on how policies can be implemented and can be given substantial weight in planning decisions. List of adopted SPDs can be found in Appendix 2.
- 2.5 The Council's Statement of Community Involvement (SCI) sets out how the Council intends to involve the community in the preparation, alteration and review of its planning documents and in planning decisions. The production of the Council's planning documents should be in accordance with the SCI.

3 Planning documents being prepared by the Council

- 3.1 The planning documents that Camden intends to prepare over the course of the period covered by this Local Development Scheme are listed below:
 - Local Plan
 - Fitzrovia Area Action Plan
 - Euston Area Plan
 - North London Waste Plan
 - Gypsy and Travellers Site Allocations
 - Community Infrastructure Levy Charging Schedule
 - Statement of Community Involvement
- 3.2 Detailed information on these documents is set out in the profiles in Appendix 1.

4 Neighbourhood plans

- 4.1 Through the Localism Act, local communities have the power to influence the future of the places they live by preparing neighbourhood plans. Neighbourhood plans are led and prepared by the community, not the Council. The Council has a statutory role to provide advice and support to those producing a plan. When neighbourhood plans are passed by an independent examiner and at a local referendum, the Council must adopt them a part of its planning framework and take them into account when it makes decisions on planning applications in the area, alongside our adopted LDF documents and the London Plan.
- 4.2 As neighbourhood plans are not prepared by the Council and their timetables are dependent on the progress made by the community, we have not included them in the list of documents in this Local Development Scheme.
- 4.3 Currently there is a strong interest cross the borough, with many communities progressing or exploring neighbourhood planning. The following neighbourhood forums and areas have been approved to date:
 - Highgate (December 2012),
 - Kentish Town (April 2013),
 - Fortune Green and West Hampstead (May 2013),
 - Somers Town (June 2013)
 - Dartmouth Park (October 2013).

5 Monitoring and review

- 5.1 Camden will monitor the progress of the work set out in this Local Development Scheme and will publish the results as part of our Annual Monitoring Reports.
- 5.2 The Local Development Scheme will be updated or reviewed where the need to do so is identified.

Appendix 1 - Document Profiles

Local Plan

Purpose / Content

The Core Strategy 2011 sets out the spatial vision and strategic objectives for Camden and the core strategic policies. Development Policies 2011 provide greater detail to those policies and sets out criteria against which planning applications will be considered. Whilst we consider that these documents are in general conformity with the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) they needs to be updated to ensure that the Local Plan responds to the current context and can deliver Council priorities and positively plan for sustainable development up until 2031.

The NPPF makes clear that the government's preferred approach is for councils to prepare a single Local Plan. The merging of the Core Strategy and Development Policies into a single document will allow for a review of the strategy, policies and supporting text and to create a more concise and direct document whilst providing adequate guidance and information on the Council's planning policies and their implementation.

Euston Area Plan

Purpose / Content

The Euston Area Plan is being produced in partnership with the Greater London Authority (GLA) and Transport for London (TfL), and is funded by HS2 Ltd following lobbying from Camden Council. The Euston Area Plan will provide a single strategic planning document for the Euston area, following its identification as an Opportunity Area in the London Plan, capable of providing large numbers of jobs and homes, and as a location for new homes and jobs in Camden's existing Local Plan. It will provide a vision for the future of the Euston area, set out long term mitigation measures to address the impacts of HS2, and ensure that Camden residents and business get the best deal possible. The Plan will take the form of an local plan (Area Action Plan) adopted as a Development Plan Document by Camden and it will also be adopted as Supplementary Planning Guidance to the London Plan as part of their suite of Opportunity Area Planning Frameworks.

Consultation will focus on the local area and the key land owner(s) as well as ensuring that the existing residential communities are involved. Consultation will be carried out in accordance with the Council's Statement of Community Involvement.

Review

The Area Plan will inform any future planning applications for the redevelopment of the station site and surrounding area. We will consider the need to review if the policies which inform it are changed or updated.

Additional comments

In January 2012 the government announced that it is to proceed with High Speed Two (HS2) - a proposal to introduce a high speed rail line from London to Birmingham, with the later potential to serve to Manchester, Leeds and ultimately Scotland. The recommended route would run from Euston Station to a new station in Birmingham. The full details of the HS2 scheme will need to be agreed by Parliament. The Bill to provide necessary powers to construct and operate phase 1 is expected at end of 2013 and construction is planned to start in 2017. Camden Council is opposing the HS2 project, but recognises the importance

of planning for the future of the area if the HS2 project proceeds in any case to ensure potential negative impacts are minimised and mitigated. The preparation of the Euston Area Plan is part of this work.

Community Infrastructure Levy Charging Schedule

Purpose / Content

To set out the range of uses and the areas in which new developments will be required to pay the Community Infrastructure Levy in Camden. The Charging Schedule will also set out the charge per square metre which new developments over a certain threshold will be expected to pay.

Since then the Town and Country Planning Regulations 2012 have been bought in, amending the statutory requirements and the Localism Act 2011 have introduced the duty to co operate and Neighbourhood Planning. We will therefore update our SCI to take these into account and update how we will involve the community in making decisions on planning applications. Once adopted, the Council is legally obliged to comply with the SCI.

Sites of nature conservation importance Guidance (September 2006)
