TfL updated the Board on the work underway on Healthy Streets since the last meeting. Camden stressed the desire for this work to cover as wide	All noted.

HS2 station design update	
Rob Carr provided an update on the HS2 station design process.	
Planning Brief update – Slaney Devlin and Simon Pitkeathly joined the meeting at this point.	
Mary-Ann Lewis presented an overview of the content of the planning brief and areas where there had been questions/debate about the level of detail shown and deliverability. There was a debate about the deliverability of building over part of the cutting as HS2 were concerned that it is not technically feasible. Agreed that as the Brief illustration is showing long term aspirations that it is appropriate to continue to show the aspiration for it to be developed over in the long term if appropriate commentary to explain the challenges is added here.	Draft Brief to include text highlighting the most challenging part of the cutting to develop over.
The draft Planning Brief is due to be published for consultation in late October for six weeks. There is a risk that the Brief will not be approved by Camden's Cabinet for consultation, or that there will be a general election, or that the Oakervee review will recommend scrapping HS2.	
SD highlighted that there is a lack of open space in Camden Town and that the redevelopment of the Euston area should be looking to re-dress this issue.	Noted.
SD raised concerns about how the Crossrail 2 worksites are shown along Eversholt Street. These are mentioned in the Euston Area Plan but not explicitly drawn but the plans reflect safeguarded land.	Officers to relook at how Crossrail 2 is presented in the draft Brief.
It was highlighted that the Euston Area Plan is due to be considered for review by January 2020. Given the change in context it is likely that it will be reviewed – the degree to which will be determined over the coming months.	
SP asked about what the retail strategy is for the site given that it is considering delivery over a long time period. LL are looking at how to take a flexible approach.	Careful consultation planning required for the Brief and then the
